SUMMER 2021!

April 10, 2021 update:

At this point in time we will be following the same protocols and procedures as last summer which enabled us to operate without a single case of Covid.

What does this mean?

We will significantly self limit our capacity while striving for a repeat performance of last summer. (no Covid)

Campers will not have to wear masks unless they are indoors.

Staff will be wearing masks when they are within 6 feet of anybody.

Swim instructors will wear clear shields when teaching the campers.

Sanitizing procedures and protocols will be a "copy n paste" from last summer. Why? because it worked so well.

Sanitizing of campers hands and all equipment before/after each use.

We will not be running our indoor activities (at this time).. We felt this was a major factor in facilitating a Covid free environment last season(basically, no indoor video arcade).

Lunches will be served outdoors in the shade.

Temperature scanning of everybody who enters our facility, including the bus, will be in effect.

Busing: Transportation will be available to all campers requesting it. If using camp transportation, Campers will be seated one camper per window seat with the exception of siblings. There will be a surcharge of \$ 75.00 per camper per week.

Sibling seated in same row surcharge will be \$45 per week.

If providing your own transportation, you will receive a credit/refund of \$40 per camper per week.

We are still waiting to hear about cohort size but are hearing whispers that Cohort groups may be enlarged to 30+ campers in a cohort. This would allow our campers to mingle with their peers in their divisions and not be limited to just their pod of 8-10 or 12-14 campers. Campers 2nd grade and older would once again be allowed to choose from several activities during a given period. Those who love the sports can choose sports and those who love the arts can choose the arts once again! 30+ campers in a cohort will also allow for travel programs to travel together, as 30+ campers in a cohort could share a bus. Therefore.....

Travel programs for 4th through 10th graders are a go!!!

We are booking the majority of our trips at outdoor venues. (see calendars) <https://www.kenwaldaycamp.com/calendars/>

As we get closer to the start of camp, we will review/visit both our outdoor and indoor venues to spot check their operations protocols and procedures. If necessary, we will change venues to only those we feel are safe for our campers, staff and families.

EXTREME TEEN TRAVEL PROGRAM will operate as "normal" once again. There will be an orientation for all EXTREME TEEN campers and their parents prior to the start of camp to review/update all policies, procedures, codes of conduct, electronic devices etc... Date of orientation to be announced.

We hope this update answers the majority of your questions at this time. If we did not answer a specific question it is most likely because we are awaiting guidance from the "powers that be".

As we move closer to the start of camp, we will continue to keep you updated on Protocols concerning testing, masks on the bus, air conditioning on the bus, staff vaccinations etc...

At this time, as we plan for camper transportation needs, we ask for your preference by email no later than April 23rd.
